

## **SUGAR & "SPICE" SHOULDER SCARF (knit)**

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Skill Level: Easy

Size: Approx. 42" wide across top x 19" deep at point

Materials:

125 yds. novelty lightweight "flag" yarn

190 yds. lightweight poly/viscose thin ribbon (sample shown in Knitting Fever "Spice" held together with Laines Du Nord "Eros")

Size 13 needles

Size H crochet hook (for attaching fringe)

Tapestry needle

Gauge: 9 sts = 4" in garter stitch on size 13 needles (with 1 strand each yarn held together)

Stitches/Terms: bind off (BO), cast on (CO), knit (K), increase (inc), make 1 (m1), repeat (rep), stitch (st)

To work "Make 1" increase (M1): On increase rows, use the "make one" increase technique by forming a backward loop on right thumb and placing this loop on right needle. On next row, knit into this extra loop.

Note on fringe: If using yarns with yardage the same as those specified above, you will have plenty of "Eros" ribbon left for fringing lower edge of scarf. Retain a few strands of "Spice" flag yarn for interspersing randomly along fringed edge.

SCARF

Row 1 (RS): Holding 1 strand of each yarn together as one, cast on 1 stitch.

Row 2 (inc row): Increase by knitting into front and back of stitch (2 sts)

Row 3: Knit even (2 sts)

Row 4 (inc row): Increase in each stitch (by knitting into front and back of stitch)(4 sts)

Row 5: Knit even (4 sts)

Row 6 (inc row): K1, M1 (see note above), K2, M1, K1 (6 sts)

Row 7: Knit even (6 sts)

Row 8 (inc row): K1, M1, K4, M1, K1 (8 sts)

Row 9: Knit even (8 sts)

Row 10 (inc row): K1, M1, knit to last st, M1, K1 (10 sts)

Row 11: Knit even (10 sts)

Continue to work as last two rows (Rows 10 & 11--an increase row followed by an even row) until yarn is almost gone, reserving enough for bind-off row and fringe, if desired. Bind off LOOSELY.

Fringe: Wind yarn around a 5" wide book or strip of cardboard, then cut at one end. Attach fringe as follows: insert crochet hook into stitch, fold strand of yarn in half over hook, pull loop through fabric, then pull both ends of strand through loop on hook and tighten knot. Trim fringe to desired length.

If necessary, lightly block scarf between damp towels.

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
